

SPOTLIGHT ON LAIDLAW COLLEGE



Ngā mihi o te tau hou Pākehā ki a koutou ngā kaiako, me ngā kaiawhina, ngā rangatira o ngā kura Karaitiana. Warm greetings at the start of this new year to all who labour for Christian education in Aotearoa.

As we go into this new year I am reminded of the words of Isaiah 50:4

The Sovereign Lord has given me a well-instructed tongue, to know the word that sustains the weary.

He wakens me morning by morning, wakens my ear to listen like one being instructed.

It is certainly my prayer and hope that we will be people who listen like those being instructed, and that we will know the right words to sustain those weary among us.

We have started this new year at Laidlaw with a great deal of hope and I am thrilled to be given the opportunity to introduce you to a couple of new appointments in the education team that will be instrumental as we go forward.

In January we were thrilled to officially welcome on board our new Head of Education Rev. Dr. Pennie Togatama. Pennie comes to us with a wealth of experience across the sector, a passion for tertiary training, education and Christian spaces. Pennie has over 30 years in the education sector, including secondary teaching – predominantly in Tāmaki/Auckland in both state and faith-based kura. She has also worked as a senior advisor for MoE, at MIT, as a prison chaplain, and is an ordained minister in the Presbyterian church.



Pennie has a strong interest in and commitment to indigenous places and spaces, culturally sustaining and responsive pedagogies, alongside her conviction for the value of faith-based learning environments. Pennie is a proud Kiwi-born Niuean and she is the mother of four beautiful Niuean-Samoan children and five gorgeous mokopuna of Niuean, Samoan, Cook Island, I-Kiribas, and Tahitian bloodlines.

Pennie holds a BA (Otago), a Grad.Dip Tchg Sec (Dunedin T-Coll), a Grad.Dip Theol. (Laidlaw College), MProfSt (UoA), EdD (UoA). We are absolutely thrilled to have appointed a new head of education with Pennie's calibre and she is a welcome addition to the mahi we do in training Primary and Secondary teachers.

Of note, we have also in July 2025 appointed a new location lead for our Ōtautahi/Christchurch based team to oversee the continued strengthening and growth of our education programmes based in Te Wai Pounamu. Mat Harris has come to us with qualifications in education, counselling and theology and a long commitment to holistic, Christian education.



He has worked as a secondary teacher in Social Sciences and Religious Education, a guidance counsellor in secondary school, a dean and senior leader in a secondary school and the Director of Religious Studies at Catholic Cathedral College in Ōtautahi. Mat was previously ordained in the AOG church and has worked in theological education and as a youth pastor.

Mat is married to Felicity, loves running, and has a deep commitment to wellbeing for all taurira, the special character of state integrated schools, social justice and equity. Mat has a Bachelor of Contemporary Ministry, Masters of Counselling, and a Masters of Teaching and Learning.

Towards the end of 2025 we were also thrilled to secure Dr. Francine Bennett whose work across the Christian education sector will be familiar to many of you. Francine is leading our Graduate Diploma of Teaching (Secondary). We are so excited with the breadth of experience, knowledge and long-term relationships in the Christian Education sector she brings to Laidlaw.

It is such a privilege to add these excellent, experienced practitioners who have a deep commitment to gospel shaped education to the education team at Laidlaw College. We continue to desire to work with you our key stakeholders, to produce teachers ready for the rigours of the classroom, who are exceptional practitioners and who have a faith that is intelligent, Jesus-centred and Bible shaped.

May our lives, mahi, and service continue to bring glory to the God who gathered children around him in Jesus, and who gives wisdom generously to all who ask for it. May we be continually asking!

SIGNPOSTING – an important tool for Authentic Christian Education

Christian education is so much more than just praying at the beginning of the lesson and ‘getting on with education’. One small but important aspect of effective Christian Education is something we can call signposting.

Signposting is the act of pausing while students are engaged in a learning activity and pointing out how this learning concept helps us understand a little more about God, or a little more about how God designed us to live, or even His love for us.

It is not cumbersome, and it is not awkward. It is the natural integration of God in our classroom. Signposting is taking 15 seconds to comment on the majesty of God when exploring the space of space.

Signposting is commenting on how we can see God's order when exploring mathematical concepts. Signposting refers back to last week's memory verse or a Scripture about God's command to love your neighbour and what happens in its absence when studying cultural unrest.

For many teachers who are mature in their faith, signposting is the thoughts that we naturally have when we explore the curriculum that we deliver to our students. However, as our students have not had the same exposure to who God is and His word, they are not able to make these connections in the same way.

Signposting builds confidence in our growing students that God is not limited to devotions or Sunday mornings. For many, it is the planting and cultivating of gospel seeds. It shares a compelling narrative with young minds about who God is and His unfailing plan for us.

Just recently, I heard a teacher saying that, in their opinion, there was too much 'Christian' and not enough 'Education' in our school. Our DP made the perfect observation that in our school, Christian Education is both 100% Christian and 100% education. Signposting is just one way that helps us realise that aspiration.

This immersive professional learning experience will take participants to a range of high-performing Christian and public schools across **Texas and Southern California**, as well as to **Baylor University**, internationally recognised for its leadership in faith-integrated learning and research-informed school leadership. Throughout the tour, participants will engage directly with school and university leadership teams, participate in guided dialogue and reflection, and collaborate with peers around transferable insights for their own leadership contexts.

Professional Leadership Focus

The tour will explore how joy can be cultivated, sustained, and expressed in leadership—both in seasons of growth and in times of adversity. Participants will be challenged and encouraged to reflect deeply on their own leadership practice, returning equipped with fresh insight, renewed purpose, and practical strategies to strengthen Christ-centred education in their own school communities.

Tour Leadership

The study tour will be led by **Andrew Taylor**, experienced study tour facilitator and school improvement consultant, in partnership with **Dr Jon Eckert**, Director of the Centre for School Leadership at Baylor University, and **Mueller College (QLD)**.

Together, the leadership team brings deep expertise in Christian education, leadership development, governance, and whole-school improvement. Their combined experience ensures a program that is intellectually rigorous, spiritually enriching, and professionally transformative.


