A Journey to Waitangi

Wednesday 5th - Friday 7th August, 2026

This is an amazing opportunity for investment by your school into your authentic bicultural journey, a chance to ask and discuss the difficult questions with a group of people who are passionate about Jesus. With just those from our group on the tour, and with the opportunity to hear the key stories from local story tellers, this will be a personalised opportunity for professional learning and development, with a Christian focus.

This experience will include visits to:

- Oihi Bay, where Ruatara invited Samuel Marsden to preach his famous Christmas Day message in 1814 (a 25-minute walk, so please come prepared).
- Historic Churches
- Waitangi Treaty Grounds including the Treaty House and the Kongahu
 Museum

Cost

The cost of this journey is being subsidised by NZACS, and is \$550 per person for a shared room. It is \$705 per person if delegates want to have their own room. Not included are your return travel to Auckland and meals enroute to and from Waitangi.

Travel arrangements

We will travel together from Auckland Airport. Delegates will need to be at the domestic terminal by 12pm on Wednesday, 5th August (for those living North of the bridge, we will arrange a pick-up place on that side).

This trip is open to staff at any NZACS affiliated school or organisation and is particularly suited to senior leaders, and leaders and teachers of te Reo Māori me ōna tikanga and New Zealand Histories.
