
Regional Coordinator Election Process

Regions may choose to set up a formal election process or call for nominations from the floor of their meetings.

Formal election process

- A returning officer is chosen by the principals of that region. This cannot be one of the nominees
- Nominations are made to the returning officer ordinarily by a principal and otherwise by a delegate from each school
- After [given timeframe] voting papers are sent to local principals and returns collated by the officer.
- Each school has one vote only, and that is ordinarily cast by the principal and otherwise by a delegated person
- Votes are counted and local principals as well as the NZACS secretary are informed of the outcome.

Electing from the floor

- A person in the group not running for the position is elected chair by the group.
- Nominations are called for and received
- In the case of a single nomination, the nominee is declared elected
- In the case of two or more nominees, a ballot is prepared, voting slips distributed and returned, and two members of the group are chosen to count the votes.
- Each school has one vote only, and that is ordinarily cast by the principal and otherwise by a delegated person
- Nominees may vote, subject to the above.
